Man's Disappearance Still a Mystery-His Car Located



The car of a missing Shelby County man has been found but detectives still have few clues about his disappearance. The white 1999 Nissan Sentra belonging to Ted Aya-Ay (pronounced EYE YEAH EYE) was located several days ago abandoned along Interstate 40 in West Memphis. It was parked on the shoulder of the west-bound lane near the weigh station near mile marker 284. Both front tires were flat.

Aya-Ay's vehicle was towed to the Shelby County Sheriff's Office crime investigation facility. Detectives are still examining items from the car. So far, nothing leads investigators to suspect any foul play.

Aya-Ay has been missing since December 14th. Just before 11 a.m, he left his home in the 8200 block of Whispering View Drive for work at a nearby Kroger store. He never arrived. He also didn't show for his second job at Federal Express.

Relatives say Aya-Ay has never left home without informing them and calls to his cell phone have not been answered.

Ted Aya-Ay is from the Philippines, speaks with an accent and has pigmentation differences on his hands and face. He stands 5'3, weighs 130 pounds and has brown eyes and black hair.
