On February 2, 2010 at approximately 1:45 p.m., a black female entered the First South Credit Union located at 3731 Austin Peay Highway, Memphis, Tennessee and

approached a teller. The black female provided the teller a demand note. The teller saw a handgun and run to the vault. The robber then fled on foot in an unknown direction.

The robber is described as a black female approximately 5'3" to 5'4" tall, thin build, last seen wearing a green hat, black jacket, green shirt, black gloves, red scarf, white tennis shoes, and black or blue pants.

The robber may have fled in a two door gold car newer model.

The robbery of the First South Credit Union represents the sixth bank/credit union robbery in Shelby County in 2010. During the same period in 2009, two bank robberies had occurred in Shelby County.

No one was injured during the robbery and investigation is continuing.

This robbery is being investigated by the Safe Streets Task Force. The Task Force is comprised of members of the Memphis Police Department, the Shelby County Sheriff's Office, Germantown Police Department, Bartlett Police Department, and the Federal Bureau of Investigation.
