



RECENT NEW FUNDING TO IMPLEMENT OPERATION: SAFE COMMUNITY STRATEGIES ¹

- Congressional appropriation of \$2,352,696 to support Operation: Safe Community, with the University of Memphis designated as the coordinator, including:
 - \$730,857 to the Memphis Police Department and \$502,328 to the Shelby County Sheriff's Office to support implementation of Strategy 1 (deployment of police officers based upon sound data and research).
 - \$150,000 to the Shelby County District Attorney's office to support funding of Strategy 13 (a communication campaign to convey the consequences of committing violent crimes).
 - \$228,000 to Shelby County government to support funding of Strategy 5 (expansion of the Drug Treatment Court program).
 - \$176,982 to the University of Memphis to develop and implement Strategy 6 (the design and implementation of a comprehensive gang intervention strategy).

- \$564,000 to the University of Memphis to develop and implement both Strategy 1 and Strategy 6 (through analysis of crime patterns and police deployment, an assessment of violent crime, and an assessment of gang activity).
- A \$9 million 6-year grant (\$1.5 million per year) from the U. S. Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration (through the Tennessee Department of Mental Health and Developmental Disabilities) to provide appropriate mental health services and support for juveniles with serious emotional disturbances including, but not limited to, juveniles targeted by Strategy 9 (the JustCare 180° program to “turn around” youth charged with unruly and delinquent offenses).
 - A federal Project Safe Neighborhoods grant of \$112,418 to the Shelby County District Attorney’s office for the funding of a coordinator for Strategy 6 (the design and implementation of a comprehensive gang intervention strategy).
 - \$125,000 from the Tennessee Commission on Children and Youth to the Memphis City Schools to support implementation of Strategy 7 (sustain and expand student safety initiatives in public schools systems).
 - A \$65,000 grant from the Tennessee Commission on Children and Youth and a \$10,000 Justice Assistance Grant, both to the Shelby County District Attorney’s office, for implementation of Strategy 8 (a mentoring-based truancy reduction program).
 - A Tennessee General Assembly appropriation of \$800,000 in support of Strategy 5 (expansion of the Drug Treatment Court program), with \$500,000 earmarked for in-patient treatment and \$300,000 for out-patient treatment.

- City of Memphis funding of \$2,050,000 to support Operation: Safe Community, including:
 - Funding of \$800,000 for implementation of Strategy 9 (the JustCare 180° program to “turn around” youth charged with unruly and delinquent offenses).
 - Funding of \$500,000 to support Strategy 13 (a communication campaign to convey the consequences of committing violent crimes).
 - City funding not to exceed \$750,000, contingent upon a dollar for dollar match from other sources, to implement Strategy 14 (development of a coordinated response to domestic violence through creation of a Family Safety Center).

- County funding of \$158,804 for the hiring of additional prosecutors in the District Attorney’s office in order to help implement Strategy 4 (increase the number of prosecutors for more effective prosecution of violent and repeat offenders).
